Background Information	In December of 2019 the City Council adopted the Tobacco-Free and Smoke-Free policy to include Dearborn Park and the Johnson Hall park. Once this policy was adopted and provided to Healthy Maine Communities, to be able to receive free signage for our parks, it was recommended that there should be some sort of 'enforcement' language added to the policy. Policy Establishing a 'Tobacco-Free' and 'Smoke-Free' Area in the City of Gardiner

Revised and Adopted on May 13, 2020

The Gardiner City Council members are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all residents and visitors. The Council recognizes that the use of tobacco, chewing tobacco, vapors, e-cigarettes, recreational marijuana, cigarettes, cigars and electronic delivery devices represents a danger to both the user and those exposed to second hand smoke from those mentioned above.

Therefore, in order to reduce this danger of exposure, the City Council hereby establishes a tobacco, chewing tobacco, vapor, e-cigarette, recreational marijuana, cigarette, cigars and electronic delivery device free-zone of 50 feet at the following locations: Johnson Hall Park, McKay Park, Dearborn Park, the Dog Park and the Waterfront.

The City of Gardiner is authorized to take reasonable steps, including signage and other communication tools, to achieve compliance with the tobacco-free and smoke-free zones established hereunder.
