2021 Goals Progress Noted by Councilors

- Made good strides despite meeting on zoom
- · Convened the Dresden Ave neighborhood
- Put asked money for city buildings assessment (ARPA Funds)
- Invested in the Boys and Girls Club
- Moved ahead with expanding ambulance staffing
- · Kept tax increases to a minimum
- Better relationships with the schools
- We were able to convene people through the Downtown Master Plan work and reconvening in Council Chambers for meetings.

2021 Goals Challenges Noted by Councilors

- Hiring challenges city manager and other staff positions
- Holding the line on tax increases is a challenge while maintaining the breadth of services
- Population growth is slow, population is aging
- There are some vacant properties in the city that are paying taxes on time.
- Short-term planning focus due to uncertainty of the pandemic
