From: Ordinance Review Committee Subject: Discharge Amendments

Date: August 30, 2022

Staff suggested that the City should revise the version of what is now called Title 28 of the Code of Ordinances to add the proposed language dealing with discharges to the part of the code that deals with Sewers and Water. The Ordinance Review Committee prepared the proposed amendments to address the revision and is recommending that City Council adopt the proposed amendments to do the following:

1. Amend the introduction to revised Title 28 to add a new Chapter 28.5 Discharges to read:

2. Amend revised Title 28 to add a new Chapter 28.5 Discharges to read:

CHAPTER 28.5

Discharges

SECTION

28.5.1 Sump pumps

28.5.2 Stormwater Drainage

Section 28.5.1 Sump Pumps

No sump pump, roof gutter, or similar drainage system shall be permitted to discharge directly or indirectly onto a public right-of-way, or to be terminated so that it discharges onto a public right-of-way.

Section 28.5.2 Stormwater Drainage

No drainage system such as a sump pump, roof drain, perimeter drain, or floor drain that is shall be designed or intended to discharge to any part of the municipal storm water system including into ditches, culverts, basins, etc. may be installed without the prior written permission of the Public Works Director, where they have deemed to be exceptional circumstances where no alternative is possible.

Any drainage may not create pooling or otherwise present a potential hazard or nuisance as determined by the Code Enforcement Officer or a Public Works Employee.
