- 4. New business:
 - a. Discuss budgets and fees for partner communities.
 - Dresden is holding their town meeting re: uncollectable bill this evening.
 Anne Davis is attending.
 - ii. Review of the budget process used to calculate community costs. Numbers on chart are for illustration purposes only, they are not real numbers.
 - 1. 3 yr avg used to calculate usage fee.

- 2. Per capita fee is based on population.
- 3. Call volume was down considerably (200 calls) for 2018.
- iii. Al is proposing a sub-committee to review uncollectable piece and try to come up with a better way to handle these costs.
 - 1. Scott, Denise (as needed), Tina, Jim P. will address this issue.
- iv. Review of proposed FY19 budget. Based on early projections.
 - Worker's Compensation rates increased significantly due to a change in legislation. The First Responder job class rate increased due to this change.
 - 2. Health insurance increases, wage increases.
 - 3. Billing company fees have been reduced after the initial year from 5% to 4%.
 - 4. These numbers do not include a 5th employee to cover overtime and to reduce the number of calls we give away.
 - Members requested updated numbers to show the 5th employee. Al will get those numbers out to members this week and email them to all.
- b. Review uncollectable analysis for each community
 - i. Tina: Is there an opportunity to have Maine Turnpike cover the uncollectable bills that occur on the turnpike?
 - ii. Reviewed FY19 uncollectable sheets. Answered questions regarding the listing.
 - iii. Jim G. suggested reaching out to other Chiefs to see what the uncollectable rates are in their communities and what they are doing about it. Old Town has a very similar business model to ours.
