That we have located a town way beginning on the easterly side of Water Street at a stake sixty six feet northerly from a stone bound four feet west of Gays Old Post Office building, thence south fifty four

and one half degrees east, over land of Wm. R. Gay fifty six feet and six inches to a stake at the northerly corner of said Post Office building; thence south sixty mine and three quarters degrees east in line with a Railroad Bridge trestle eighty six feet to a stake near the easterly end of the cap of said trestle: thence south thirty two degrees east, three hundred fifty six and one half feet to a stake at the large barn or stone house on land of K. & P. R. R. Co., this line being the southerly and Westerly line of said roadway, which is twenty two feet wide on the northerly and easterly side, except in passing the trestle of the K. & P. R. R. Co. bridge on the northerly side of said roadway, where it shall be nineteen feet, turning the angle with the radius of twenty two feet, which will more fully appear on the plan of survey, accompanying this report made by G.
