Noye's notes and minutes in relation bounds of streets - encroachments upon them or made when surveying and locating the streets in 1859.

"All the monuments marking the <u>City Survey</u> are Granite posts about 8 inches square and marked with the letter M, or iron rods from 3 to 4 feet long set in Granite blocks & buried so as to leave but an inch or two above the surface of the ground in the true angle. And where a ledge occurs the angle is marked by a drilled hole with a letter M near it. In all cases the Granite posts are set entirely in the Streets so that the corner made by its two outer sides is the angle.

Care should be used by the street Commissioner not to mistake any of the numerous stones marking division lines for the boundaries of the street lines.
